# What is Legally required to get Married

## Bride & Groom

must obtain a marriage license from county clerk's office

(Public Marriage license)

They'll need their driver license or birth certificate

The Ceremony must have a Declaration of intent other than that the format is open (I do's)

### Witnesses

Need to be old enough to understand & witness the Declaration of intent

### Officiant

the officiant, must witness the declaration of their wish to be husband and wife.

The officiant is required to examine the marriage license prior to the ceremony and must be satisfied as to the correctness of the statement of facts before solemnizing the marriage. For this purpose, the person may administer oaths and examine the parties and witnesses in the same manner as the county clerk does before issuing the license.

The Officiant must return the marriage license to the County Clerk within 10 days of the ceremony.

In California, it is the ordination by the denomination that gives each clergy member the authority to perform the marriage rite (Ordination Certificate)
